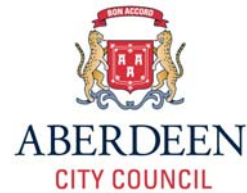

Key Changes





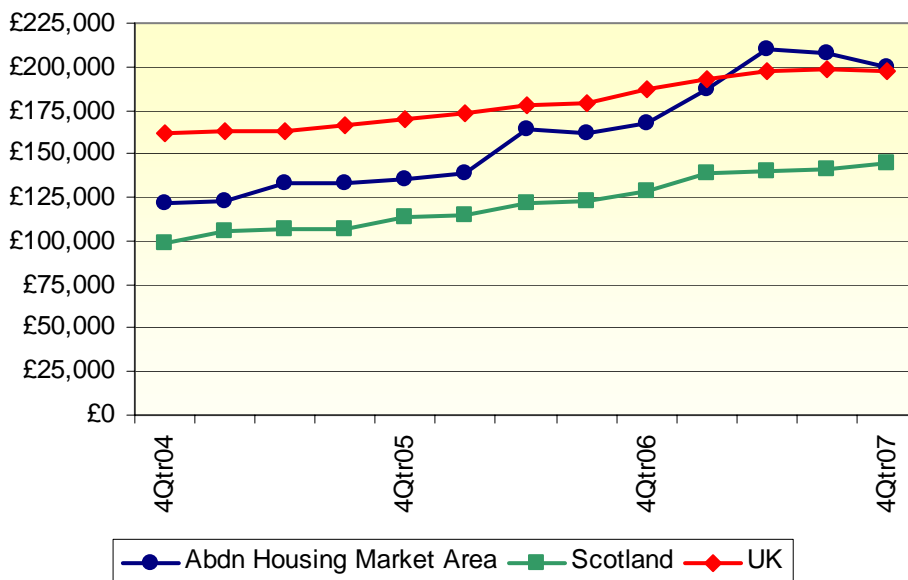
-  The average property price in the Aberdeen Housing Market Area for the fourth quarter of 2007 is £199,589, a decrease of 4% on the previous quarter figure of £207,316.
-  During the quarter, 1,355 properties were added to the property register, and 1,662 were sold. The overall number of properties on the register for the Aberdeen Housing Market Area is 972.
-  The average property price in Scotland is £144,897, an increase on the previous quarter (£141,435).
-  The UK has also seen a decrease from £198,664 in Q3 2007, to £197,671 in Q4 2007.

Houses for Sale

During the quarter there has been a decrease in the number of properties on the register, from 1,506 to 972.

The Aberdeen housing market area has seen a decrease of 4% in house prices on the previous quarter.

All analysis in this bulletin with the exception of the national house price figures, relate to the Aberdeen Solicitors' Property Centre statistics for the Aberdeen Housing Market Area. The national house price figures are taken from HBOS.

Figure 2 indicates the average property price by accommodation type, for Aberdeen City. The majority of areas have experienced either a decrease or no change on the previous quarter. The average price for flatted properties in Midstocket/West End, and Peterculter/Cults/Bieldside/Milltimber remains high.

If there are fewer than 10 sales for a particular area, this price has not been included. This is to ensure that a reasonable sample base is used to provide the average figure.

During the period quarter 4 2006 - quarter 4 2007, 248 new build properties were sold through ASPC. The average new build property price for this year period was £269,129.



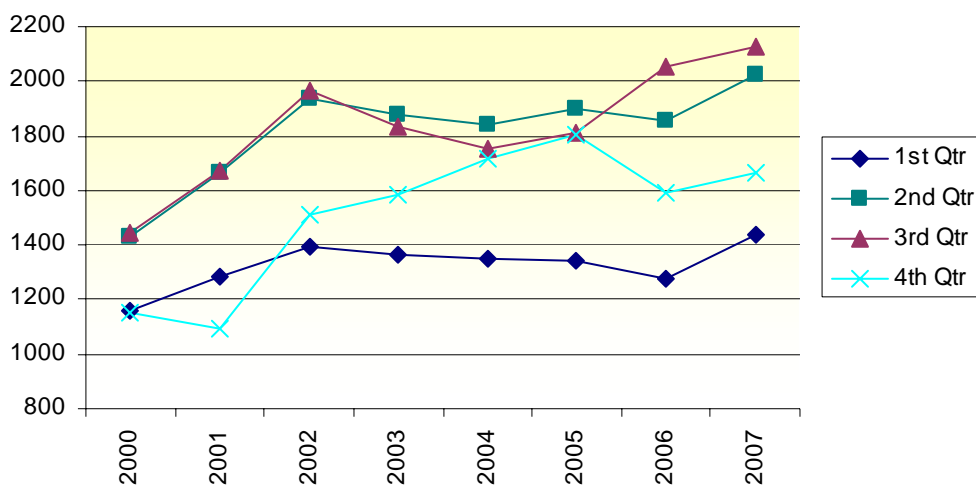
Fig 3. Average House Price by Area

As can be seen from figure 4, the number of properties sold per quarter has increased over the last 7 years. Each quarter displays it's own trend, for example the first quarter of every year remains lower than the other quarters, but is still steadily increasing. Quarter 4 has seen a slight increase compared to previous years.

FOCUS ON... Kemnay

Houses for Sale

During the period quarter 4 2006 - quarter 4 2007, 34 properties were sold in Kemnay. During the same period, 41 properties were added to the register. The average annual secondhand price of a non-detached property is £168,288. The average secondhand price of detached properties is £221,765. During the same annual period the average price of flats is £125,712.



Comment

Kemnay, once famous for its granite, has evolved to provide a local village with a good mixture of traditional and modern family housing. Most sales in Kemnay are of detached and semi detached family homes. Flats are very much in the minority, in this market, and married couples with family have been snapping up new builds in recent years as prices are more affordable in Kemnay than Aberdeen City. Once quite a sleepy village, Kemnay is now a bustling village with good local amenities and road links to Inverurie and Aberdeen.
